

“LOST TREASURES-SAVING HISTORY” WITH THE PLEIN AIR PAINTERS OF EL PASO

“Lost Treasures-Saving History” by the Plein Air Painters of El Paso will be the new show at the Downtown Library. The opening will be Friday, December 2, from 4-6 pm.. The show runs through January 2, 2017.

The show will feature paintings done on site. It is about the old buildings in El Paso that have been torn down or are in danger of being taken down and also about how some buildings are being restored or re-purposed.

Officially formed in 1997, the Plein Air Painters of El Paso started off as a small group of Plein Air enthusiasts, but grew steadily until they were exhibiting at such locales as The International Museum of Art and The Chamizal National Memorial, as well as the Department of Interior Museum in Washington, D.C. Member artists exhibit their works, all created on site at locations throughout the area.
